


MY FAVOURITE THINGS—DOTTY BORDERS



Approx. size 77 1/2in x 77 1/2in

Notes!

*I will be adding extra blocks to my version of the quilt. If you want to continue this mad journey with me don't add the borders yet. If you are saner than I am, you can finish your quilt here. These instructions are for the 10 x 10 block quilt. I hope you had fun, thanks for joining our sew-along. Much love, toni xx
Ps. I will be adding the extra (21) blocks over the coming weeks.*



What You Will Need

- ◆ (84) 4in squares of fabric in assorted colours and prints.
- ◆ Scraps of fabric for the applique.
- ◆ 50cm (1/2 yard) of complimentary fabric for the binding.
- ◆ A piece of wadding (batting) measuring at least 83 1/2in x 83 1/2in.
- ◆ 4.3m (4 3/4 yards) of 42in wide complimentary backing fabric

How to Make the Borders

1. Cut (84) 4in squares from assorted fabrics for the borders. Centre and fuse the appliqué spots to the 4in background blocks. Stitch around the appliqué shapes as before.
2. Sew (20) circle blocks together end to end to make a long border strip. Press the seams in the direction that will allow them to butt together with the quilt top. Repeat to make (2) borders.
Pin and then sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt carefully matching the seams. Press the seams towards the centre of the quilt.
3. Sew (22) circle blocks together end to end to make a long border strip. Press the seams in the direction that will allow them to butt together with the quilt top. Repeat to make (2) borders.
Pin and then sew them to the left and right-hand sides of the quilt carefully matching the seams. Press the seams towards the centre of the quilt.
4. From the backing fabric cut (2) pieces approximately 83 1/2in long. Remove the selvedge.
Sew the (2) pieces of backing fabric together along the long edges. Press the seams open, then trim to make a piece measuring approx. 83 1/2in x 83 1/2in.
5. Press the quilt top well. Layer the backing, wadding (batting) and quilt top, then baste them together using your favourite method. Start quilting from the centre and work your way out to the edges until finished.
6. Optional: Sew buttons to the character's faces for eyes where indicated on the pattern templates. Sew the buttons in place through all thicknesses of the quilt using strong thread. Knot securely.
7. Sew the (8) 2 1/4in binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Trim the seams to 1/4in and press them open. Fold the binding strip in half lengthwise, wrong sides facing, and press well.

Use your favourite method to sew the binding to the quilt, then label and date your quilt to finish.
